ground. After we finished eating the man who made us the food was kind enough and gave everybody a sweet.









Welcome to Year 5's exciting Blog! ☺

In English, we were writing topic sentences for paragraphs about Pac-man reports. Topic sentences work like sub headings and it introduces the paragraph or topic. After that, we did

a challenge. The challenge was to create an introduction and a conclusion paragraph about a Pac-man report. (Non-fictional). Conclusion means the ending paragraph. E.g. of the topic sentence 'this is a one player game.'

In Maths, we were learning about equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. For example 0.97 = 97/100 = 97% and 0.33 = 33/100 = 33%. After that we converted the fraction into its simplest form. We did that by dividing the number. For example, 30/100 = 3/10. (Divide by 10). We then answered questions about percentages.

In RE, we were continuing what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today. We created a mind map about the challenges that some Muslims might face. We also learnt about what diversity means. It means people come from different background and live together in peace and harmony.



## Year 3's Blog

Welcome to Year 3's spectacular blog!

In English we wrote the meanings of the key words we learnt. Words like preposition, conjunction, prefix subordinate clause and direct speech. E.g. prefix is a letter before a word that changes the meaning. Such as the word safe changes to unsafe with the prefix un. We then watched a little bit of Fantastic Mr

Fox. And we identified adjectives, verbs, adverbs, and nouns from the same story on part of a speech.

In Maths we ordered numbers on a number line. We went up to 1000 and 10000. We then watched a video to learn how to count backwards in 100s. We also figured out how to spot the biggest and smallest number on the number line. In Art we started to actually do decoupage. We previously designed our own art works using different techniques. Then cut out the printouts we wanted and stuck them on a paper plate to make our decoupage.

In RE we have been learning about the 'I am' statement that Jesus made. This week we looked at the meaning of 'I am the good shepherd'. We wrote down the characteristics of a shepherd, which are responsible, nurturing, compassionate, kindness, alertness, and helpfulness- as salvation. Jesus is the good shepherd because he has the same characters and is always looking after us.
