

Welcome to our magnificent blog! In English we have been about

noun phrases. They expand and give more information about the head noun. E.g. the crispy snow, a lonely ice berg and a cosy den. We then were given a text from a story about polar bears. We identified the nouns and expanded them to noun phrases and wrote our own paragraph using them. We also looked at how to write persuasive letter with a purpose. We then wrote persuasive letters to our teacher to buy us ice lollies.

In Maths we are learning about identifying different types of triangles. There are 4 types called: right angle, isosceles, equilateral and scalene triangle. We also looked at horizontal and vertical lines in 2D shapes. We then explored symmetry in shapes of different side numbers and orientations. We then identified shapes with at least one line of symmetry. Such as a circle, a rectangle and a pentagon.

In Geography we are exploring the similarity and differences between our own cultures and the Amazonian tribes. We also looked at facts about rain forests in Brazil and Australia. We then learnt about how the Amazonian tribe called the Kayapo tribe live in the rainforest. They mainly eat meat and make fire out of wood. Our similarities in the life style is they have families and look after each other. In English we are learning about perfect present tense. First, we unscrambled 3 sentences that use the words has or have. Then, we made our own sentences using perfect present tense. E.g. Barbarous has

been living in a secrete laboratory for many years.

In Maths, we are learning about 4 different types of triangles. Here is a list: Isosceles which has two equal sides and two equal angles, Equilateral which has three equal sides and three equal angles that are 60 degrees, the right angle triangle which is 90 degrees in the corner, and last but not least, scalene which has no equal sides and no equal angles. WE also are learning about symmetry and different shapes while identifying horizontal and vertical lines.

In Geography, we are learning about sketch maps and land use. We drew out our local map while different symbols like the cross which represents the church and orange blocks which represents residential and last but not least, green circles which represents recreational.

In Art, we are learning about sculptures. We got some iPads so that we could look for inspiration on what to make/draw. After that we drew out our design and we also wrote why we chose that design and what methods we will use to create our piece of art.

In English, we had to read and annotate a report. Miss Boateng (Our teacher) gave us 7 questions including a challenge question. We answered all 7 questions, a couple of them were: 'find and label all 6 sub-headings' and 'Find 3 examples of technical vocabulary'. Our challenge

question was to write down our own questions and the answers to them.

In Maths, we were looking at Statistics. Miss Boateng gave us a question sheet. The questions were about: 2 way-tables, line graphs and time tables. One of the time table questions were; 'What is the distance between Ely and Leeds? We had to figure out how many kilometres was the distance between them. We used subtraction to find out the answers.

In Geography, we learnt about coasts and their features. A coast is a strip of land that meets the Sea or the Ocean. It could be such materials as: sand, rocks, mud and gravel. Examples of a coasts are lagoon, spit,

arch, stacks, beach and cave. We were put into six groups. We then chose which coastal features we will explore. After that we researched our chosen coastal type and feature. We then made our posters and presented them to the class.

In RE, looked at what giving to charity means to Muslims. It's called Zakat, which is the third pillar. In our class we took a survey about the signs of those in need in our community. Some of the responses were: people begging for food, people sleeping on the streets.

In Music we are looking at songs that were written in different languages such as Latin. German and Spanish. We then rehearsed some songs that Mr Gioferee gave us. We are going to perform the songs we rehearsed at the Royal Albert Hall on the 9th of July. By Adan and Gabriel
