Welcome to Year 5's fantastic blog !!!

In English, we have been learning about the features of a report. Some of the features are: facts and opinions, topic sentences, concluding paragraphs (to sum up) and introductory paragraphs. An

example is a Space Invaders report. We drew a table with three columns and three rows. we wrote three questions and three detailed answers.

In Maths, we have been learning about percentages (out of a 100). An example is 1/10 = 10% or 5/10 = 50%. To help find out a percentage you can use a 100 square/bar models (with ten squares) and look at the shaded amount. Some of the class did worksheets on making wholes with tenths.

In DT/ART we are learning about Digital Art, so we focused on two digital artists called: David Hockney and Davida Anara. Then, we designed our own prototype of our digital art design which we later drew on an app called Brushes Redux on the iPads. After that, we wrote a reflection in our books. We enjoyed using the app.

In Geography, we have been learning about rivers and the water cycle. This week, we learnt about the features of the coast. So we split into six groups and each group focused on a different feature: the features are arches, beaches, coastal lagoons, caves, spit and the stack. Our group did arches. An arch is formed by two caves on a headland, then erosion takes it one step further and joins the caves together.

In Espanol, we have been learning about Spanish and Latin American festivals. We wrote short emails as Carmen, Pilar, Jorge, Juan Pablo. They are friends from all around the world that speak Spanish. *From Elyaa and Millie* !!!!

Dear St Cuthbert children and parents,

In English we wrote poems for Refuge Week. All of us wrote our














An amazing Art display from Year 4 about sculpture and artists.

In Maths we have been learning about rounding to the nearest 10 and 100. It means going to the closer ten or hundred. For example 132 to round it to the nearest 100 would be 130 because it's closer to 130. We also learnt about a method to use to round up or down. Its '4 or less let it rest and 5 or more let it soar'. We then learnt about estimating the answer to addi-

tion and subtraction questions.

In English we have been writing poems about refugees. We then wrote our own poems for refugee week, which was last week. We also drew pictures based on the poems. Before that we have been have been learning about present perfect tense. It's when we have been doing the same thing in the past and are doing it now. E.g. I have been in London for 8 Years.
